## African-American Vernacular English (AAVE)

(AAVE, African-American English, Ebonics [Ebony + Phonics], Black English)

Copula Deletion (AAVE)

- She ugly
- You crazy
- He workin'

Copula Contraction (SE, AAVE)

- She's ugly < She is ugly
- You're crazy < You are crazy
- *He's workin' < He is working*

Copula Deletion in AAVE follows the Copula Contraction rules of English

- Neither Deletion nor Contraction is possible if the Copula is stressed
  - Here I ám. \*Here I'm. \*Here I.
  - I wonder where he is. \*I wonder where he's. \*I wonder where he.
  - Do you know what that is? \*Do you know what that's? / that?

Copula Deletion is possible in AAVE precisely where Contraction occurs in SE.

• This shows an intimate connection between the two varieties rather than a major structural difference.

Habitual (Invariant) be in AAVE

- *He be workin'* (at his job) vs. *He workin'* (at the moment)
- *That coffee be cold* (all the time) vs. *That coffee cold* (right now)
- Represents a morphological category difference between AAVE and SE
  - Note the meaning differences between *be* and deleted copula
