Arranged Marriage

- parents don't believe their children are old enough to make good decisions (parent always approve of the marriage & partner)
- keeps clear structures.
- selects a spouse from a worthy group/family
- less divorce - do not want to upset families/parents
- strengthens links between families
- solidifies parent-child ties

Bridewealth

- woman is property being bought
- compensation for loss of woman in family (for work)
- class status - shows woman is worth
- to show respect for opposite family - solidifies relationship
- material contribution to the joint union
- sign her publicly the worth of the bride.
- security → to bride in case husband dies (his family has invited in her to will continue to support her children)
- tradition
- gift helps out wife's family economically.
- shows off status
- woman: happy about amount man's family willing to give her (wife's son's kids)
- convenience
- tradition - don't think of anything else.
- family pressure to follow tradition

Polygyny

- class status
- economic reasons
- man: power for more wives he has
- more wives = more goods = more money
- wives = working force
- increase # of children (for O² only)
- if a wife is barren, can remain married with little to no shame (not get divorced)
- companion ship
- stability in marriage
- signs her publicity the worth of the bride.
- security → to bride in case husband dies (his family has invited in her to will continue to support her children)
- tradition
- satisfies sexual needs of male when can't have sex with 1 wife (but's kid)
