Why are women oppressed?

- Women are closer to nature.
 - Culture dominates nature.
 - Men dominate women.

* 3 ways Women are closer to nature

1) A woman's body and its function are more closely linked to life.

Women are "more enslaved to the species than the male, her animality is more manifest."

2) A woman's social role is closer to nature
Breast feeding and child rearing place women in the domestic sphere.

3) A woman's psyche is closer to nature
Girl / Concrete / Nature
Boy / Abstract / Culture

* Women used to have power but w introduction of capitalism nuclear family became important - woman's role in household had less power

* draws on Marx "Karl"

Marx - looked at exploitation as principle
but this was only applied to
white males / class conflict

Leacock applies this principle to women
as an oppressed group



* Women back in the day who had power:

Manenko - young woman chief
of a Balonda village
in the Congo

Naskapi ppl of Canada - group decisions,
powerful women Shamans, tortured
prisoners more than men

* gender constructionist:

evil capitalism changed the
role of women, not biology -
but history has conveniently
ignored this!

the environment (change to capitalism)
affected womens power, not their
biology

similar to cultural determinism
