Note that I encourage academic creativity, so you are free to write about a topic of your choice, so long as it is centered on the book The Trobrianders of Papua New Guinea. If you go this route, remember is that your task is to **thoughtfully** and **thoroughly** explore a theme or issue that interests you and that is intellectually relevant. You should NOT simply summarize the book, and you must include in your paper original analysis and insight.

SUGGESTED TOPIC:

Focusing on the book *The Trobrianders of Papua New Guinea*, examine how Trobrianders solidify kinship and "regenerate matrilineality" through ritualized exchanges. Specifically, you should explain, compare, and contrast harvest competitions and women's mortuary distributions (also known as *sagali* or *lisaladabu*).
